Livestock Forage Disaster Program

FARM SERVICE AGENCY NEWS Millie Alexander, County Executive Director

The 2014 Farm Bill makes the Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP) a permanent program and provides retroactive authority to cover eligible losses back to October 1, 2011. LFP provides compensation to eligible livestock producers that have suffered grazing losses due to drought or fire. LFP payments for drought are equal to 60 percent of the monthly feed cost for up to 5 months. LFP payments for fire on federally managed rangeland are equal to 50 percent of the monthly feed cost for the number of days the producer is prohibited from grazing the managed rangeland, not to exceed 180 calendar days. The grazing losses must have occurred on or after Oct. 1, 2011.

Sign-up will begin on or before April 15, 2014, at any local FSA service center. Additional details on the types of information required for an application will be provided as part of the sign-up announce-ment. Some eligibility restrictions may apply. At this time, FSA does not know details. Please contact the office at 770-358-0787 Extension 2 for questions concerning this program. Signup will be announced in local newspaper when details are provided by Washington.

Bledsoe Farm

The UGA CAES Statewide Variety Testing program provides annual performance testing results on several commodities including canola, small grains and forage, corn and silage, and field crops. The UGA Bledsoe Research Farm in Pike County serves as one of seven research farms conducting these tests.

Proper variety selection is the most important decision a farmer makes. Farmers want and need to grow the best adapted crop cultivars to be successful. But producers do not have the time or the resources to plant several cultivars to determine available. That's where UGA Agronomists step in to help.

They have steadily worked to improve farm infrastructure, pastures, and herd genetics. The sale of beef shares was a new venture, as was a retail beef program for the last three vears. Management practices on the tour include: riparian buffers, K-line pod irrigation, rotational grazing, cone feeders on concrete pads, Durana clover, hay storage, marketing locally raised beef, Grassworks weed wiper, Cattle Max data management in the cloud for use in the field, and training herding dogs.

NOTES FROM WES Forage School

A Forage School will be held on March 18, 25 & April 1, 2014. The programs will start at 7 pm except for the last night and it will start at 6:30 since a meal will be served. Dennis Hancock and Glen Harris will speak the first night about soil fertility and forage establishment and management. On February 25th, Wes Smith will discuss rotational grazing and Jacob Seagers will talk about problems with forages. The final day, you will have the opportunity for a pasture walk in the afternoon. Following the meal that evening, Gary Hawkins will present information about solar power for livestock operations, and the USDA Service Center will provide an update on their programs and a pesticide safety program will be held to give participants 1 hour pesticide credit.



Are we having a winter to remember...or forget...in GA? I enjoy some cold weather but will gladly join those saying let winter be gone. I hope any difficulties you experienced were minimum.

We recently had years of drought in which fertilizing forages was limited, wasn't feasible or both due to high prices. Last year abundant rain grew more grass which utilized soil nutrients and the rain contributed to considerable nutrient leaching. I believe soil testing will definitely reward you this year. Bermudagrass is a heavy user of fertilizer nutrients. A 6-ton per acre hay yield will remove significant quantities of fertilizer nutrients (see Table 1), which must be replaced to maintain soil fertility levels.¹

Table 1. Fertilizer Nutrients Removed in 6 Tons of Bermudagrass Hav

Many are asking about late plantings of winter annuals. Even with relatively inexpensive seed cost there are a lot of

All conditions...as in planting, growing, fertility, moisture, etc... will have to be ideal and remain ideal in order for it to pay off....and by not planting it last fall the majority of the growing season is lost. See Dr. Hancock's comments in his forage update for more on this topic...yet another

reason to visit www.georgiaforages.com. Many are asking about the wood ash product currently available locally and its use as a fertilizer and or soil amendment. I've seen an analysis of the product and in short, it's an affordable amendment. Its best use is as a liming material. The results of material tested which I saw showed a calcium carbonate equivalent of 40.75% meaning one ton of wood ash has 815 pounds of lime; it has some N, P, K but not a lot and it also contains several secondary nutrients. In a ton: N was 3.6 lbs/ton, P at 14.2 lbs/ton, K at 51.4 lbs.ton. Calcium at 75.2 lbs/ton and magnesium at 73.8. So, the product is a cost affordable way to apply K and also achieve a pH neutralizing effect on soil. I would not hesitate to use it or recommend its use at the liming rate. If your soil test pH is low and lime is recommended, one ton of wood ash will provide 815 pounds of lime. Plus you get over 50 pounds of potassium and our forages have strong potassium needs. Don't go nuts with the product as it would be easy to drive pH high quickly. Stay within lime recommendations based on soil test results. Here's some more info on using wood ash as a soil amendment:


