



INGREDIENTS

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

2 pounds boneless beef top round steak,

cut into serving-size pieces

1/4 cup butter, cubed

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained

1-1/2 teaspoons salt

1/4 teaspoon dried basil

1/8 teaspoon pepper

1/2 cup chopped green pepper

1/2 cup chopped onion

1 cup (4 ounces) shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese

Directions:

1. Place flour in a large resealable plastic bag. Add beef, a few pieces at a time, and shake to coat. Remove meat form bag; pound to flatten.

2. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, brown steak on both sides in butter. Add the tomatoes, salt, basil and pepper; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 1 hour or

until meat is tender.

3. Add green pepper and onion. Cover and simmer for 25-30 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Sprinkle with cheese; cook 2 minutes longer or until cheese is melted. Yield: 6-8 servings.

President Danny Bentley called the meeting to order. Tom Freeman led the Invocation.

Farm Day will be held May 5th in Upson County and April 30th in Spalding County.

The Pike Health Fair will be held on March 20th from 7-11 a.m.

County Agent Reports

Wade Hutcheson stated that the scholarship name will be changed to Mid-Georgia Cattlemen's Scholarship, and we will need to find ways to fund it after this year. Applications are being accepted for this year's scholarship.





Vet Talk

As we are approaching spring time, I wanted to discuss the causes and signs of cattle being affected by Hypomagnesemic tetany or what is commonly referred to as "grass tetany". Hypomagnesemic tetany is a metabolic disease dealing with magnesium, calcium, and potassium. This metabolic disease typically affects lactating cows and nursing calves. It is rare in nonlactating cattle but has occurred when undernourished cattle were introduced to green cereal crops. Often the cow/calf is found dead with no signs or explanation as to why.

So, in our cattle herds, our main concern is "how do our cows develop this and how is it treated/avoided.

Grass tetany is characterized by low levels of magnesium in the body, but when calcium levels fall below average this process becomes deathly; and, why we primarily see lactating cows on green lush pastures mostly effected.

Low levels of magnesium occur when animals are grazed on lush grass pastures or green cereal crops especially during spring and fall when potassium and nitrogen intakes are high do to either our soils being naturally high in potassium or, have high potassium levels due to fertilizer such as potash and nitrogen. High potassium ingestion results in decreased absorption of magnesium in the GI tract.

What are the signs of grass tetany? In the most acute form, affected cows, may appear to be grazing normally, but suddenly throw up their heads, bellow, gallop in a blind frenzy, fall, and exhibit severe paddling convulsions. These convulsive episodes may be repeated at short intervals, and death usually occurs within a few hours. In many instances, animals at pasture are found dead without observed illness, but an indication that the animal had convulsions before death may be seen from marks on the ground. In less severe cases, the cow walks stiffly, is hypersensitive to touch and sound, urinates frequently, and may progress to the acute convulsive stage after a period as long as 2–3 days.

Treatment for grass tetany has to be immediate in order to give them a chance for survival. Your veterinarian should be contacted and he/she will begin to correct the low magnesium and calcium levels with intravenous and oral medications. The cow can relapse within a 36 hours if proper supplements are not given daily.


If your cows are at risk of grazing a pasture with high potassium soil levels then prevention of grass tetany can be initiated by giving magnesium supplements daily to your lactating moma cows.

On February 26, 1946, the first Fat Cattle Show was held under the parking lot shed on the West side of Martha Mills. The show was sponsored by the Agricultural Committee of the Thomaston Kiwanis Club and the Upson County Beef Cattle Association. Harry Colquitt won Grand Champion Steer and Joe Hendricks won Reserve Champion Steer. There was a 4-H Judging Contest using show cattle from Fra-Mar Farm and Downs Farm of The

Rock. Winners in the older category were Roscoe Boyt and Edgar Legg and the 10-12 category went to Billy Morgan and Franklin Young. The judge for the events was Dr. Milton P. Jarnagin, Head of the Animal Husbandry at UGA. Following the award presentation, W. W. Dewey, Assistant to the Head of Animal Husbandry at the GA Experiment Station presented a "Type Demonstration". Other prize herd cattle were on exhibit by James Reeves, Ben Butts,

and Bill Johnston. Prize money totaled \$150.

Frank Binford commented in the 1946 Thomaston Times newspaper, "The success of Tuesday's exhibition, in his opinion, will pave the way to make Thomaston the center of cattle shows for possibly fifteen counties in the future." The vision of this first group of cattlemen and Kiwanis members has been alive for 70 years thanks to the support of local businesses, organizations, donors, 4-H Agents, FFA Advisors, Extension Service, parents and the Mid-GA Cattlemen and Cattlewomen.

In 1947, there were 25 calves in the show. The showmen took their calves to the upcoming Macon Show and Upson merchants traveled to Macon to purchase all Upson County calves for minimum price of \$.25 per pound for good calves and \$.30 per pound for choice cattle.

Nearly 5,000 people attended the third show which included 31 calves. The Atlanta Journal-Constitution attended the show. The Grand Champion was shown by Hugh Hendricks. In the 1954 paper, Hugh stated that he was saving his money from showing cattle to go to college and he had saved \$1500. He went to college and became

known to this area as Dr. Hugh, an excellent Veterinarian. Upson County Farm Bureau and Lions Club joined the sponsors.

In 1949, there were 41 entries that totaled \$10,000 when sold. Then in 1950, contestants showed their cattle at the Tabernacle and held their sale at the Georgia Farm Products Sale Barn. The Judge stated, "There is no other place in Georgia where the businessmen show more interest in developing the livestock program than in Upson County." Throughout the years, this statement has remained true. The West Central Georgia Shows have always been backed by local merchants and cattlemen.

In 1955, the show was moved to the Georgia Farm Products Sale Barn. The next year the show increased to eight counties and 42 entries. The Hog Show was added in 1958 and the cattle and hog shows were held together until the early 1970's.

In 1963, the Mid-Georgia Cattlemen's Association joined other groups in sponsoring the show. In 1974, there were 78 steers shown. Then in 1977, the Mid-Georgia Cattlemen became the main sponsor and local businesses and cattlemen continued sponsoring prize money while also adding the heifer show that included 11 heifers. The short, white wooden fence that had been used through the years was replaced by a 6 foot fence for safety according to the 1977 Bull Sheet.

A cow/calf class was started in 1987 and in 1988 the steer sale was discontinued. The Middle Georgia Show was added in 2000 and the shows were moved in 2007 to the Upson-Lee Agriculture Center.
