USDA *Producers Can Now Enroll in ARC and PLC*

USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) is accepting enrollments and elections for the Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage (PLC) for 2025 from Jan. 21 to April 15. ARC and PLC provide financial protections to farmers from substantial drops in crop prices or revenues and are vital economic safety nets for most American farms. The American Relief Act, 2025 extended many Farm Bill-authorized programs for another year, including ARC and PLC.

Producers can elect coverage and enroll in ARC-County (ARC-CO) or PLC, which provide crop-by-crop protection, or ARC-Individual (ARC-IC), which protects the entire farm. Although election changes for 2025 are optional, producers must enroll through a signed contract each year. Also, if a producer has a multi-year contract on the farm it will continue for 2025 unless an election change is made.

If producers do not submit their election revision by the April 15 deadline, their election remains the same as their 2024 election for commodities on the farm from the prior year. Farm owners cannot enroll in either program unless they have a share interest in the cropland.

Covered commodities include barley, canola, large and small chickpeas, corn, crumbe, flaxseed, grain sorghum, lentils, mustard seed, oats, peanuts, dry peas, rapeseed, long grain rice, medium grain rice, safflower seed, seed cotton, sesame, soybeans, sunflower seed and wheat.

USDA also reminds producers that ARC and PLC elections and enrollments can impact eligibility for some crop insurance products including Supplemental Coverage Option, Enhanced Coverage Option and, for cotton producers, the Stacked Income Protection Plan (commonly

2025 Mid-Georgia Cattlemen's Scholarship

Attention: A \$1000 scholarship is available to graduating seniors and college students who have graduated from the Mid-Georgia Cattlemen's Counties.

Deadline: April 1 @ 5:00 - Upson County Extension Office

- Applicant's parents and/or grandparents must have been members of the Mid-Georgia Cattlemen's Association two years prior to applying for the scholarship and continue membership while receiving scholarship funds.

- Recipient must enroll as a full-time student at any college/university or technical school.

- Scholarship recipient must maintain a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 or above each semester. If GPA falls below 2.5, the recipient will not receive reimbursement for that semester. If the next semester GPA is restored to 2.5 or above, scholarship eligibility is restored. Disciplinary action can also stop funding.

- Recipient will be required to defray first semester expenses. After presenting grades and receipt of paid expenses, applicable expenses will be reimbursed.

- The scholarship is \$1,000. Selection committee may divide sum as it deems necessary.

- Applications will be made available to officers and directors of Mid-Georgia Cattlemen's Association and to County Extension Agents in Lamar, Monroe, Pike, Spalding, Talbot and Upson counties.

- Individuals can only receive scholarship one time.

- Applications will be reviewed and scored by the

scholarship committee and the application with the total highest score will be the winner.

- The recipient must have graduated from high school/home school or received a GED in one of the six Mid-Georgia counties

RECIPE CORNER



Irish Beef and Beer Stew



Ingredients:

- 2 pounds beef Chuck Roast, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 2 teaspoons vegetable oil
- 1 onion, diced
- 1/2 pound button mushrooms, sliced
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1-12 ounce can dark beer
- 1 parsnip, diced
- 1 turnip, diced
- 1 pound red-skinned potatoes, diced
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 teaspoon dried thyme leaves
- 3 cups beef stock



Cooking:

1. Season beef Chuck Roast cubes with salt and black pepper to taste. Heat oil in a large stockpot over high heat. Sear cubes until brown, about 5 to 6 minutes. Remove cubes from pan and set aside.
2. Turn heat down to medium; add onions, mushrooms, and garlic to the pot and cook until lightly browned, about 4 to 5 minutes.
3. Pour beer into the pot and stir, scraping up and dissolving any browned bits of food into the liquid. Stir in tomato paste, thyme, turnips, parsnips, potatoes, salt and pepper. Add back in beef cubes and add enough beef broth to cover all ingredients, about 3 cups.
4. Bring stew to a gentle simmer, stirring to combine; reduce heat to low and cover pot. Simmer stew until beef is fork-tender, about 2 hours, stirring occasionally.
5. Remove cover and raise heat to medium-high. Bring stew to a low boil and cook until stew has slightly thickened, 5 to 6 minutes. Remove from heat and adjust salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with parsley, if desired.
